

IGRA COVID-19 Plan 2021

September 6, 2021

It is generally the intent of the Board of Directors:

- That the 2020 rodeo year be extended through 2022, becoming the 2020-2022 rodeo year with a term of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022.
- That the corresponding Finals Rodeo occur in 2022 for the 2020-2022 rodeo year.
- That IGRA not hold an Annual Convention in 2021.
- That, since the election of officers occurs only at Annual Convention by vote of the delegates, the current officers (president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer) continue in office for an additional year.
- That membership in IGRA (Member and Recognized Associations), which was extended through 2021 last year, not be extended through 2022. Rather, that Member and Recognized Associations be required to renew their membership in IGRA in 2021.
- That IGRA Appreciation Awards, which normally coincide with the Annual Convention, be presented in 2021 despite there being no 2021 Annual Convention.
- That the terms of Trustees, which was extended by one year in 2022, not be extended an additional year.
- That certified officials retain their certification for an additional year.
- That the term of IGRA royalty, which was extended by one year in 2022, not be extended an additional year.
- That a Royalty Competition, required by the standing rules to be held in conjunction with Finals Rodeo, be produced for 2021 despite there being no 2021 Finals Rodeo.
- That exhibits be interpreted to reflect the interpretations annotated in the bylaws, standing rules, and rodeo rules voted upon as part of this action.
- That Member and Recognized Associations conduct their business as they deem appropriate, keeping in mind their obligation to be in concurrence with the stated goals and purposes of IGRA.
